- 86% of side hustlers do it at least once a month. This includes 96% of people between 18 and 26, and 83% of people over 26.
- The amount of money earned through side hustles tends to differ across generations.
- 36% of side hustlers earn more than \$500 per month through their secondary work.
- 50% of baby boomers reach this income level, compared to just 19% of millennials, who on average, earn \$200 per month.
- Those in their fifties and sixties are most likely to earn over \$1,000 per month.
- Just over half of people who side hustle use the money they earn to cover necessary expenses, with only 46% seeing the money their side hustles earn as disposable income.
- How side hustle earnings are used varies according to gender, with women more than twice as likely as men to use their earnings to help with expenses.
